From the President

I imagine that many of you viewed the coronation of King Charles III on May 6. It was extensively covered in the press and on television. The crowning of British monarchs in Westminster Abbey started with King Harold followed by King William in 1066, which indicates the longevity of the royal tradition in the United Kingdom. Our Prime Minister, Anthony Albanese and the Governor General, David Hurley, were coronation guests.

A contingent from the Australian Defence Force took part in the impressive parade of some six thousand troops. There was an additional and major Australian contribution to the coronation through the gold and black Diamond Jubilee State Coach pulled by six horses in which King Charles and Queen Camilla rode from Buckingham Palace to Westminster Abbey. This coach was made in Manly by Jim Frecklington, who, although Australian born, was once master of royal coaches and coachman to the Queen Elizabeth II. It was presented to Queen Elizabeth II in recognition of her Diamond Jubilee as Queen.

Although having the appearance of a traditional coach, it is quite modern in operation. It has hydraulic stabilisers to prevent swaying, is air-conditioned and has an aluminium chassis and outside panels. The window frames and interior decorative wooden panels are made from material donated from many sites across the United Kingdom including Caernarfon Castle, Canterbury Cathedral, 10 Downing Street, the Mary Rose, and also from the Antarctic bases of Captain Richard Scott and Sir Ernest Shackleton. The seat handrails are from the royal yacht Britannia, and the crown on top of the coach is carved from timber from HMS Victory.
