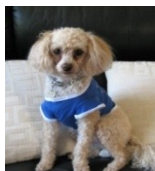



GUEST SPEAKER:- The Guest Speaker for August was Alan Foskett who gave us a really interesting talk on the topic The Mystery of Molonglo. At the end of 1918 China declared war against Germany. An internment camp was built in Fyshwick by 1,200 men under the direction of Brigadia Reginald Spencer Brown for Germans who were taken prisoner in China. When the camp was finished the Germans had been sent elsewhere.

At the same time Berima Jail was built along with a school and DAMS Hospital. A young boy Bert Kailsen aged 10 was interned at the Gold Coast. When he grew up he became the central figure in organising the Fuzzy Wuzzy angels. When the camps closed they became a workers settlement. Pretty soon there were 800 to 1,000 people living in camps. In 1926 a school was built for students from 3rd, 4th and 6th grades. A garden was created in order for the families to grow vegetables. The Molonglo Community were a very close knit. Despit this there were a few problems with some of the workers. A person

called Jacko finished up in court for being drunk whilst riding home and ended up being fined 1 pound. His horse was also fined 10 shillings. Alan read a poem "Ode to Canberra. Joan Munro thanked Alan with a vote of thanks on behalf of the members and gave him a bottle of wine.
