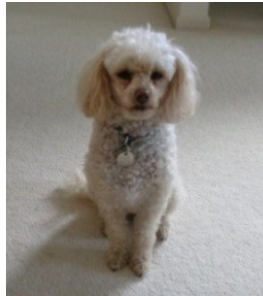

**ELLA'S AMAZING FACTS:**

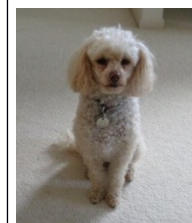


- \*Work is either fun or drudgery - It depends on your attitude, most people like fun.

**GUEST SPEAKER:-** Pictured is Tessa Kenehan introducing our guest speaker for March, Dennis Dyer. Dennis gave a very interesting talk about python snakes in



Australia. He said that there are more types of python snakes in Australia than anywhere else in the world. They range from very smallest in the world, the pygmy pythons to one of the very largest, the 5 to 6 metre long, carpet python. Python snakes are not poisonous like most of the other snakes in Australia. They rely on crushing their prey to death. He also talked about the Aboriginal folklore around pythons, in particular

the rainbow serpent. Dennis had brought along his pet python, Ben. He brought him in a backpack and showed it around to the members who could hold it or stroke it. When Ben woke up he gave it its dinner, a frozen dead rat. A vote of thanks was given by Linda Dack.
