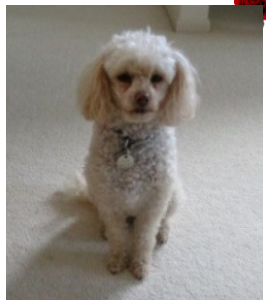

*The Daffodil is the birth flower for March.

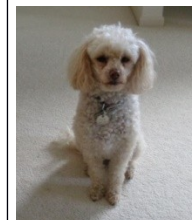

GUEST SPEAKER:- The Speaker for May was Rolf Hartley, a retired engineer. Rolf had been National President of Engineers Australia. His other main interest is Military History and being a guide at the Australian War Memorial.
 Rolf spoke about Sir John Monash. Monash had been both an engineer and soldier. He recounted the significant contribution Monash had made in helping to win the first world war. This contribution was recognised by being knighted by King George in the field of war. His successes had been



achieved in spite of all the opposition to him by Australian High Society because of his Jewish ancestry.

Monash's successes in his working life as an engineer were also outstanding. He completed many difficult projects. He was also the driving force behind the establishment of the Victorian State Electricity Commission and the building of the first power stations in Victoria.

Rolf also talked about the personal aspects of Monash's life and the difficulties he had to face as an outsider in Australian Society.
