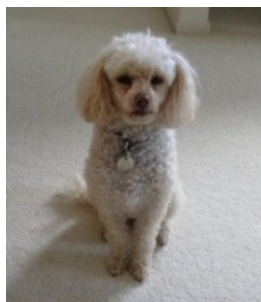

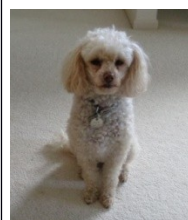

GUEST SPEAKER:- The guest speaker in June was Millie Sutherland Saines from the Woodlands and Wetlands Trust. Her talk was very enthusiastic and interesting as she told us about her work and the excellent attempts being made to preserve wildlife in the ACT. The two areas she works

in are the Mulligans Flats Woodlands Sanctuary and the Jerrabomberra Wetlands Reserve. She explained how they had been established to ensure that they provide a rich and diverse environment for future generations. The woodlands are surrounded by an animal security fence to keep out predators, such as foxes, and to keep the endangered species in. One particular story she told involved her research work with the journey of the Latham's Snipe. This bird flies between Japan and Australia. The ones that come to Jerrabomberra are fitted with satellite trackers so that they can be followed on their journey. She also told us how buried WW1 trenches had been found in the wetlands. They had been used by troops for training before going to the Western Front. The photograph shows Millie being given a vote of thanks by Carol McHarry.
