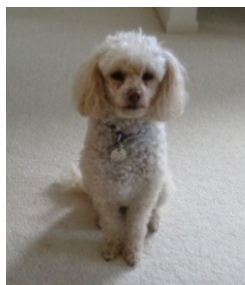

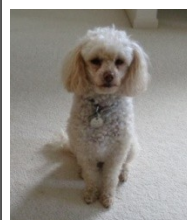

Guest Speaker: The guest speaker in June was Dr Tim Mather, BVSc. His talk was about climbing Mt. Kilimanjaro. Tim is a semi-retired veterinarian recently arrived in Canberra after a career in WA. A lifelong interest in bushwalking led to the expedition to Kilimanjaro. Mount Kilimanjaro is a dormant volcano situated just south of the equator in Tanzania on the African continent. Its summit at 5894 metres is the highest point in Africa and as such, is attracting great interest from

tourists around the world. Hundreds of tourists climb it every day during the dry seasons, and each visitor is accompanied by porters and guides.



This talk was about one such climb accomplished in July 2018 at the height of the tourist season. He told us about the trek preparation, clothing and nutrition requirements for altitude walking and mental preparation for extreme endeavours.
