Before it received its current name, this little island just off the mainland held thousands of years of indigenous storylines. Following white settlement, Dangar Island played an important role in the discovery of much needed farmlands for the newly colonised Sydney. Governor Phillip used the Island as a base for his explorations of the Hawkesbury River, resulting in the farming settlements of Windsor and Richmond. Later, the Island housed the construction workers for the Railway Bridge, completed in 1889. Enjoy a guided walking tour of this historic island (or a cruise around it for those who don't wish to walk), followed by our Postie-Ploughman's lunch on board the boat.

Question: How do you detect bias in news reports?

Discussion group report: meeting Wednesday 19th March

Topic: Is compulsory voting more democratic

The usual suspects were in attendance for our chat on Compulsory Voting with the question as to whether it results in a more democratic outcome. As it turned out, it was a very relevant topic as the Federal election has been called for 3 May 2025.

Only 23 countries in the world have compulsory voting and Australia is the only Anglophone country on the list. Studies show that countries with compulsory voting tend to favour more progressive policies and therefore more progressive governments. But not always. Brazil is on this list and it elected Bolsonaro as President. Compulsory voting results in greater voter turnout. In the 2013 federal election voter turnout was 92%. Compare this with the 2024 Presidential election in the US, where voter turnout was 63.9%. Only a third of all eligible voters voted for Trump. Talk about winning by a landslide.

Does compulsory voting – remember Australia also has preferential voting – result in a more democratic result? It is certainly more democratic as the percentage numbers above show. It is more democratic since more people vote. With this reckoning alone, Putin is the most democratically elected world leader gaining 88% of the vote in the 2024 election.

Does the right to vote also include the right not to vote? Is this a limit to our right to freedom of speech, i.e. voting? In the 2013 federal election, Mark Latham encouraged voters to hand in blank votes in protest for being forced to vote. We did not come to any conclusion on this.
