Last month **Gil Lewis** from Australian National Maritime Museum (ANMM) delivered her amazing story "The Long Road Home", about discovering the identity of a serviceman lost in a naval sea wreck off WA during WW2 and the role DNA played in the process.

Not only was the story fascinating, but the way in which Gil delivered her talk was faultless, professional and at one stage, quite emotional for her. She kept her audience engaged with the human side of the story, and kept the scientific side simple enough to understand how the DNA processes finally enabled this young sailor to be identified. The power point presentation complemented her delivery.

Report: 2025 Moree and Lightning Ridge KTG TOUR



After departing Central for final pickup of fellow travellers we headed north in the rain, then west

towards Singleton for our 1st luncheon together at Singleton Diggers. Travelling in a 50 odd seater,

very comfy Travelon Coach with large scenic windows we stopped at Breeza to peruse Ben Hall Wall. After a while travelling on we had an afternoon-tea stop in a quaint little town named Willow Tree, where some visited a wonderful leather shop and varying nick nacks. A few handbags were purchased and possibly more items if time had permitted. Our first night was spent at Gunnedah. The following beautiful sunny, refreshing 9deg. morning we all enjoyed a yummy breakfast to start a sightseeing tour around Gunnedah, viewing Dorothea Mackellar Silo famous for her



verse of "My Country" painted by artist 'Heesco' based now in Melbourne.



Onwards to Narrabri with a population of 9,000 where we enjoyed our morning tea break.

Off to visit the huge cotton fields, as we had seen on trip driving in to Moree. As we were watching a massive cotton picker machine working, it pulled up next to our coach and out jumped from the driver's seat a long blonde haired female, which was a bit of a surprise to us all. Her long, blonde flowing ponytail was all the way to the top of her legs.. Quite stunning....

Off to visit a cotton gin in production, whilst on a tour of same, samples were acquired by us. Then, next onto the Artesian Pools for a test of the waters at our Moree Motel before dinner. Some of our fellow travellers were nearly cooked enough to serve as our dinner due to one of the thermal pools being quite hot...

Picking up a Tourist Guide for an on-board informative trip around Moree Town, we then had some free time to wander through the nicely landscaped township and shops with vine covered pergola areas outside the cafes plus a lovely Memorial Area still displaying wreaths from ANZAC Day. Back to the Moree Serviceman's Club for lunch, then on the road again heading for Lightning Ridge. Driving along the road we noticed a fair amount of water lying on the flat countryside, so guessing a lot of rain had fallen here in recent times. Today is a lovely warm sunny day, so the place to be compared with the coastal weather back home. Stopping at Collarenebri on the Barwon Riverbank for a break and cuppa.

The RIDGE as the locals call it has a Population (?) as people come and go and some don't want to be accounted for but census comes in around 2000 for those that filled one out.



House of Bottles Museum has some extremely old relics as does many places in The Ridge as most things are just left lying around once finished with, therefore a Tip doesn't seem to be required. Most of the several thousand bottles used to build The Bottle House are beer bottles and they face bottle base inwards, as constructing with bottles does create a fair bit of internal light and are readily available.

Next off to Amigo's Castle, which was never really settled into by the Builder but now used occasionally for weddings, school celebrations and various functions. Large stones (rocks) are collected from all over the countryside and handled with great care for the construction over many many years. The Castle is now managed by a family member.

Bevans Opal Cactus Gardens has been a family interest for several generations, so some of the Cacti are very aged and large.

A trip down over 80 stairs into an Opal mine with 900 sculptures hand carved with only a knife by Ron Canlin on all the walls of the many tunnels in the 'Chamber of the Black Hand' and we all managed to climb up The Stairway to Heaven on return without requiring CPR. The things one does to keep out of the heat whilst searching for opals. Apparently Ron didn't have much success with finding opals hence the carvings were opened up for the public to view. Before departing LR some of the early risers wandered around the Sunday Markets, then we were off to Coonamble where we had morning tea in a lovely park but as toilets were locked due to vandalism, we had to make a quick stop down the road where luckily Silo painting of galahs was enjoyed and photographed.

We stopped for a wonderful lunch supplied by Gilgandra Coo-ee Centre and a tour/talk of the Coo-ee March commencing with 25 men from Gilgandra back in 1915 and marching 515km, 34 days later arriving in Sydney with 263 recruits. Driving on down through Gulgong where Noel our ever-capable coach driver lives when home, we arrived in Mudgee for our final night of a wonderful tour. The next morning, we had a trip around Mudgee then off to Gooree Park a massive horse stud being guided/informed by the most knowledgeable person of horses I've come across, then a wine tasting of wines from their cellar. Back to Mudgee for our last meal together then homeward bound via Central to drop off some of our fellow passengers arriving back to Engadine around 7.30pm finalising a wonderful tour visiting some very green parts of NSW.
