For over 150 years the Quarantine Station was for many, the beginning of a new life in Australia after making the arduous & lengthy journey from their homelands.

After the tour we have lunch at The Terrace, still within the grounds of the Q Station, consisting of a selection of Chef made sandwiches, small selection of cakes and fruit platter as well as coffee and tea.

### **DANGAR ISLAND bus and ferry trip**

The weather held off and the traffic minimal on our early start to Mooney Mooney with bus driver, Mark entertaining our group of 33 with his interesting life story as farm manager, sheep shearer, Jackaroo and truck driver. On arrival, we boarded our ferry, hit the water and had morning tea with home-made Anzac biscuits. The Hawksbury River was down to 15% salt content, running fast and the ferry had to negotiate a few logs, courtesy of the heavy rains. Our boat captain, gave us an informative talk about the history of the rail bridges from 1889 to 1973, the submarine nets used in WW2, the surrounding sandstone used in the Sydney Town Hall and Queen Victoria buildings and the different oysters grown along the river.



On reaching Dangar Island, our host, Cathy, took us on a lovely walk of the island, which is serviced with electricity, internet and a regular ferry service. It was an easy walk through lush vegetation to the sandy beach on the other side of the island. We were surprised to hear that 250 people live on Dangar in dwellings that are as eclectic as the people who live there. Properties sell for between 1.5 and 2 million dollars. There is a

strong community spirit and a desire to maintain the natural environment and we heard about the island's "bush telegraph" , and the controversial " Golf Buggy War". Cathy also gave us a rundown on the islands original private owner, Henry Dangar, who bought it in 1864, building a substantial home in 1891 ( which burnt down in 1930). He later leased the island to the Brooklyn Bridge builders. The island was subdivided 1921 when Henry's son sold it.

A lovely lunch on the return ferry trip topped off a great day.
