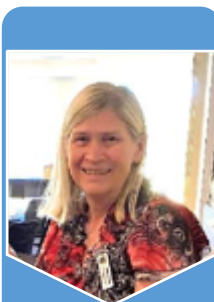

GUEST SPEAKER REPORT submitted by Jill Fitzpatrick

Ralph Scrivens was our guest speaker at the June 28 meeting at Engadine. This was a return visit for the bush poet who was obviously well received on the last occasion.

He opened his recital with a rendition of Banjo Paterson's "The Man From Snowy River" – a poem that always sends shivers up my spine. His delivery was great – pausing in just the right places to build up anticipation and then pouring out his words with excitement and enthusiasm. This poem was written by Banjo in 1890, and was more than likely written about young Jack Riley who Paterson met in the Snowy Region.

Ralph said he was told long ago to always include at least one serious poem. His choice for this session was "I Killed a Man at Graspán", written in 1907 by poet and journalist Montague Grover. This poem reflects the mindset of a young soldier who had killed a man in battle during the Boer War, but who could not come to terms with taking another man's life. Ralph's delivery was poignant and chilling.

Ralph then changed up a gear and had us all laughing with the (anonymous) poem "Buying a Bra". A farmer's wife asked him to "pick up a bra" for her while he was in town. What that entailed was hilarious. I think the men in the audience all identified with that predicament!

Next up was "Australian Made", a poem written by John Dengate, whose father was born before WW1 and was a strong union man. This had us all pondering our present industrial

situation, as the author made us think how times have changed and lots of our goods and services now originate overseas.

“The Day the Spaceship Took Aunt Meg” was a humorous look at poor Aunt Meg who was taken by aliens, and sadly, brought back to her husband! Poor Aunt Meg ... nobody, not even aliens, wanted her.

“A Bush Christening” written in 1893 by Banjo Paterson, had been a request from Ralph’s previous visit. Banjo’s humour came through as Ralph acted out the various speaking roles in this iconic poem. Ralph made mention that the famous Henry Lawson was a bit grim in his poetry, and that is why he preferred to recite Paterson who was more light-hearted. Ralph also made us think how Paterson would be amazed at how his famous his Matilda is with “Waltzing Australia”, by Tim Borthwick, and how Waltzing Matilda is our unofficial anthem.

“Why Doherty Died” was rather a long poem about ill-fated Doherty and how he met his end in the pub near “Billabong Creek”. This was written by Thomas Spencer in the early 1900’s.

Anonymously written “Drinking From My Saucer” finished Ralph’s session. The poem’s message is how we all have a different journey in life, but let’s all remember our blessings and how our cup overflows with good times – hence the need to drink from the saucer.

Ralph was warmly received by our group and I could have listened to many more of his renditions. Perhaps we can invite Ralph again! Jill Fitzpatrick

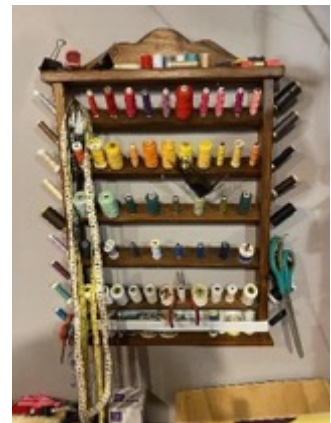
