Message from The Webmaster Alan Williams.

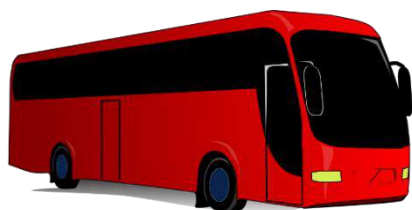

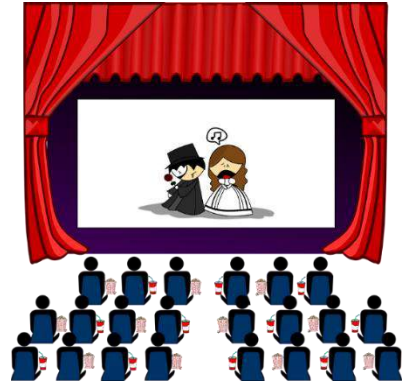

OUR GUEST SPEAKER FOR OCTOBER

Our October Guest Speaker will be Clive Baker who will amuse us with fascinating stories of "The Shire" during WW2 Aircraft crashes on Cronulla beach

October guest speaker -- *military and civil air crashes in the shire - Clive Baker* during his 50 years as a shire resident, Clive developed a growing interest in the history all around us. His particular niche is the military history of the shire, from Cook's arrival to the army depot at Sutherland today. After a period working with the Sutherland shire historical society, he became a founding member of the shire military history club. He and the club researchers have revealed many interesting military stories of the shire and people who lived here. He and his team also conduct monthly tours of Woronora Memorial park, revealing the lives of those who now rest in those grounds. The October presentation covers both military and civil air crashes and other incidents in the shire.

REVIEW OF OUR GUEST SPEAKER IN SEPTEMBER.

GREG INGLIS - Marine Rescue Botany Port Hacking Unit --

Greg presented an excellent overview of the importance of the *Marine Rescue Botany – Port Hacking*. Greg spoke about Marine Rescue Botany Port Hacking Unit which operates fast response rescue vessels, covering the waters of Botany Bay, Georges River, Port Hacking and fifteen (15) nautical miles seaward between Wedding Cake Island and Stanwell Park. They also operate Solander Radio Base, located at Hungry Point, Cronulla. Their unit is a 100% volunteer organisation. Their mission as a volunteer emergency service is "saving lives at sea". While many of us now don't own a boat or watercraft, we know many families and friends who do. And the services provided by Marine Rescue keep us safe while we enjoy our leisure activities. This is a truly magnificent community volunteer group that has been instrumental in the saving of numerous lives through dedication to our local waterways. The group is located at Hungry Point Cronulla and has 3 vessels in the fleet of rescue boats backed up by an extensive support of specialists and enthusiastic volunteers.

To maintain the coverage for the safety of the boating public, they need 50 volunteers a week to run the boats and the radio room. The radio room plays a significant part in their safety programs, and is operated from 5am - 6:30pm, 7 days a week/365 days a year. The local community of sporting clubs and generous individuals recognise the absolute importance that Marine Rescue provides by donating funding to keep them operating. Government also provides some funding.

Greg explained one of many of the essential services offered is the ability for water way users to inform Marine Rescue of their presence on the water by way of several easy-to-use methods, simply Log-On” via Marine Rescue Internet App, direct radio contact on special marine channels RADIO CHANNEL 16 ON VHF OR CHANNEL 88 ON 27MHZ, or normal phone services. Simply contact Marine Rescue at the start of their journey “Log-On” and again at the end when back on dry land to Log-Off”.

Please urge your “Boaty Family and Friends” to follow the safety rules.
