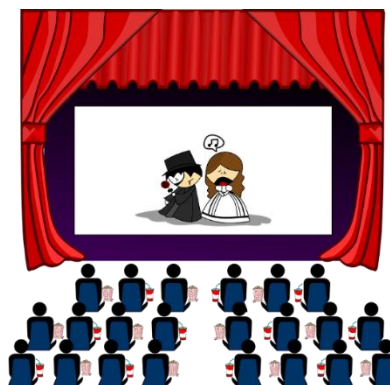

### Opal Tripper's Report

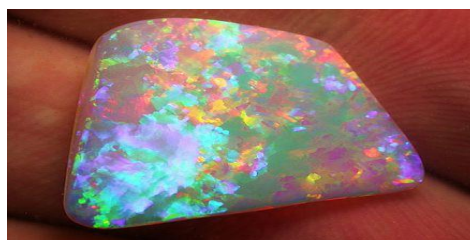
