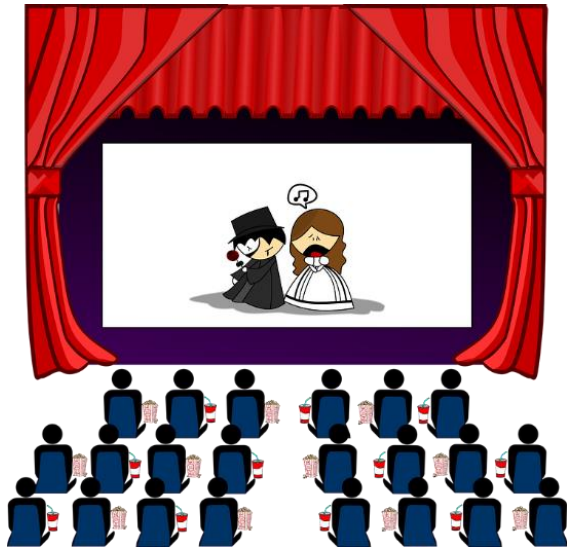


At next week's meeting we will welcome two new members to our club, Anne and Chris Corben, with the possibility of inducting another as well. If at any time you change any of your contact details, phone

The story of Swallow Rock is that a gentleman was fishing from his boat around the rock and was oblivious to the rising tide that caused his boat to get stuck under the rock resulting in him drowning. True??? No Idea. What I do know as truth is that a young chap dived into the river from a row boat at the bottom of Grays Point Road at house number 5 to release an anchor so he and a group of teenage friends could take the boat out rowing. He was most unfortunate enough to actually dive onto a shark which grabbed him around the torso.

At that time North West Arm Rd ended in a gully now nicknamed Frog Hollow and did not go right down to Grays Point as it was cut off by a creek. The ambulance waited at Frog Hollow for the lad to be brought up to the creek crossing to be carried across but by the time they got him there it was too late. Quite a few years ago the friend who jumped in trying to save him from the shark was awarded a bravery award. He had not lived long enough to receive the award personally.

Grays Point has quite an interesting history. During the depression after WW1 many homeless people set up temporary homes at the end of Grays Point Road, paradise found. Remnants of their tin shacks and wrought iron beds were still there in the early 1970's. Overgrown by grass and weeds they had been long forgotten. Most of the evidence of their existence has gone now including one lone olive tree and a huge carpet of freesias. If you search you will find a few large, flat rocks which had once formed part of a makeshift jetty.

On our January craft day we had 14 ladies in attendance. I for one had a great time just getting together and having a laugh with a bunch of awesome girls.

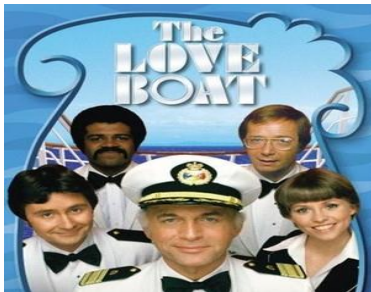

OPAL TRIP TO WATSONS BAY ON WEDNESDAY, 8TH MARCH

Information for all those members coming to enjoy a ferry trip on our beautiful harbour and lunch at Watsons Bay. We will be departing Engadine Station Platform 1

at 9.32am and we will be meeting in the 2nd carriage. We change trains at Town Hall from Platform 5 to Platform 6 (from one side of the platform to the other) arriving at Circular Quay at 10.30am

Travel by ferry is from Wharf 2 and departs at 10.45am and arrives at Watsons Bay at 11.08am

Lunch can be any of the following;

1. **Bring your own to eat in the park** adjacent to the ferry wharf. There are tables and chairs available and some shade. **2 Fish and chips are available** to purchase as Take Away at the land end of the wharf ...the water end of the wharf has enclosed, undercover tables and chairs, with a beautiful view, where
2. food can be eaten as long as drinks are purchased. **3. Watsons Bay Hotel** has pizza and other meal options available... the menu will be displayed with the 'activity sign on form' at the next meeting. A booking can be made if you would prefer to eat here, but credit card details are required.

Travel home will be on the 1.45pm ferry from Watsons Bay and the 2.21 pm train from Circular Quay. We do need to change trains again at Town Hall moving from Platform 1 to Platform 4 (which involves walking down about 25 steps) arriving back at Engadine about 3.45pm

Cancellation. In the case of bad weather the event will be cancelled by text around 7am on the morning of the excursion. Please ensure your mobile number is recorded on the excursion sheet on the notice table.

OPAL TRIPPERS COCKATOO ISLAND VISIT



Just a final reminder of our outing on **Tuesday 21st February 2023**. We will be catching the **08:41 train from Engadine Station (08:38 from Heathcote)** to the city. WE will catch the **3rd carriage** to keep everyone together. We need to alight at Town Hall to catch a train to Circular Quay. This normally only requires crossing the platform, but if there any problems (closed lines, rail delays etc) we can catch the light

rail from Town Hall to Circular Quay

There are a number of different services that stop at Cockatoo Island so we will catch the first one available. Wharf 5 is where they leave from. We need to catch the 14:13 ferry (2:13pm) to come home so that we beat the peak hour and after school traffic. The ferry trip to and from Circular Quay is about 20 minutes. On return to Circular Quay we will catch the light rail to Town Hall, This avoids multiple train changes. At Town Hall, as you alight the tram there is a elevator that takes you to the concourse and then an escalator to platform 4

Suggested activities on Cockatoo Island: For history buffs the most interest is up the hill. There are convict built buildings, visual displays and film archives that will hold your interest for a couple of hours. There are also areas where you can relax and take in the magnificent

views up and down the Parramatta River. The road up to the top looks quite steep when you first look at it but I negotiated it quite easily and is not difficult.

For those with mobility problems there is plenty to see on the lower part of the island, this is where the shipbuilding, and ship repairs took place and the old machinery will astound you. (the Princess of Australia, which ran from Sydney to Tasmania, HMAS Voyager, and HMAS Supply were all built on the island. HMAS Melbourne was repaired there after it collided with, and sank, Voyager)

There are 2 cafes on the island, one each side of the island. Both cafes are reasonably priced and both are licenced to serve alcohol. (sitting in the gardens, under the shade umbrellas, sipping on a cocktail, or sharing a bottle of wine, sounds pretty good to me). Buying a sandwich or wrap and taking it up the top also appeals.

Remember medical cards & wear your Probus badge as we may have new members that do not know our names. If your name was on the list but you are unable to attend please let me know.

There is an information centre at the wharf with maps and they will answer any questions that you have. If you have any questions for me my number is **0403 029 582**.
