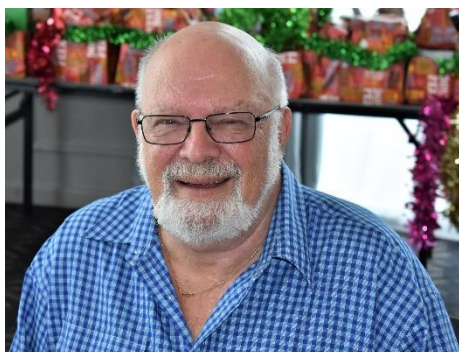

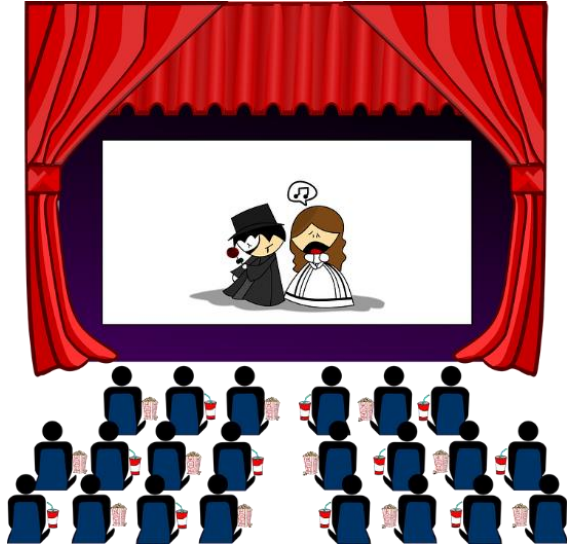
Hi everyone,

## Truth Must Out. Submitted by Garriock Duncan

What follows is a sort of *mea culpa* statement, an apology for wrong history. The wrong history was my brief survey of the history of Como, in particular that of the Como Hotel. I now know that it was much more complex. The truth is now available for all to read in Kim Hatherly's recent article (" 'A Capital Hotel'. Como

Hotel's History: Re-Examination of the Evidence") in the February issue of the *Sutherland Shire History Society Bulletin*.

The February 2023 issue , no. 226, is now available on the Society's archive page ([www.shirehistory.org/bulletins.html/](http://www.shirehistory.org/bulletins.html/)). Just start entering "Sutherland Shire Historical Society" into your search engine and the link to the archive page should appear on your monitor screen.

Hatherly's article is fully documented and totally busts a local urban myth, that of the so-called German connection with the Como Hotel. There never was German Club, supposedly one of the manifestations of the Como Hotel, and no German navvies working on the rail line south (Hatherly, p. 27).

In my report, I mentioned the continued existence of the spring Pliny had his picnic by. Recently, SBS screened Bettany Hughes' 4 part mini series, *Driving from Paris to Rome* (probably available on SBSonDemand but certainly available on Youtube). In part 3, Hughes visits Milan and Florence with a side trip to Lake Como. And she visits the Villa Pliniana. However, it might not be the best place to have your Lake Como picnic. The Villa Pliniana is a very up-market boutique hotel. A night in a lake side room will cost you in the vicinity of €8000! You probably wouldn't get a good night's sleep worrying about the cost .
