PORT KEMBLA This trip was something a bit different, quite a few of us visited the site, do not know how many were impressed or how many found it boring, I myself had no idea what to expect. Arriving at Coniston Railway Station a bus picked us up and took us to the visitor centre where we began

our tour, first stop was at Greenhouse Park where there is a picture of the Port laid out beneath us.

Next we enter the Inner Harbour being Port Kembla Coal Terminal, the Grain Terminal and the states largest Motor Vehicle import hub and cruise ship berth.

Next we visit the Outer Harbour precinct offering us spectacular views of the Inner Harbour berths. Our last stop was at Hill60 with amazing panoramic views of the Illawarra Coastline. Port Kembla is a man made cargo port with an Outer Harbour protected by break waters and the Inner Harbour constructed by dredging. It once employed more than 22,000 workers, now there are only 5,000. It also had beautiful gardens that use to hold many tours, now no longer.

To finish the day lunch was at the Coniston Hotel, nice modern pub, food fresh, tasty and not overpriced. From lunch is was back on the train homeward bound after a long days outing.

Our most recent Opal Trippers adventure saw 19 brave members depart from Heathcote, Engadine, Loftus and Sutherland stations, for a train trip into the city where we all piled on to the Light Rail for a quick journey north along George Street, for a few stops, then march along Bridge Street until reaching our goal of the Museum of Sydney. Having made good time on our travels, despite a minor cancellation of our first train, we hit the café for a much needed cappuccino and a couple of minutes to recover from the journey.

As we waited patiently for opening time, we were advised a section of the museum had been closed off as part of an upgrade for a new display featuring the 50th Anniversary of the Sydney Opera House opening. This display will open a little later in the year and may present another Opal Trippers tour opportunity, if you are interested, let me know. This situation presented an unscheduled opportunity to be addressed by one of the senior tour guides, who gave us an impromptu session on the items at the front of the museum, in the courtyard, which is actually the site for the first governor's residence. There is also a display at the front of the museum, which incorporates a number of large poles erected vertically into the ground, which all have a specific historical significance.

Following our tour of the museum and several interesting documentary films on the history of Sydney, we departed following a short management meeting, where we





decided to move our lunch site to the north side of the harbour and jumped on the next available Manly ferry. Walking up the Corso towards the beach, we split into two groups, so we did not overwhelm one venue for lunch. Strangely enough both groups found separate pubs to recuperate from the morning's historical endeavours.

Following lunch and refreshments we found a gelato bar on the wharf, where we got desert, then piled aboard the next ferry back to Circular Quay, where we boarded the next train to commence the journey home.

Thank you to all members who attended, we had a great time with quite a few laughs along the way.

On Tuesday 18th July, we will be heading south to the coastal township of Kiama, home of the world famous Blow Hole and a host of gift shops and cafés along a couple of streets, smack bang in the middle of dairy country and rolling hills.

Catching the 9.29am train from Heathcote and 9.32am from Engadine stations we will alight at Sutherland, change to Platform 2 and catch the 9.58am from Sutherland to Kiama landing at 11.39am.



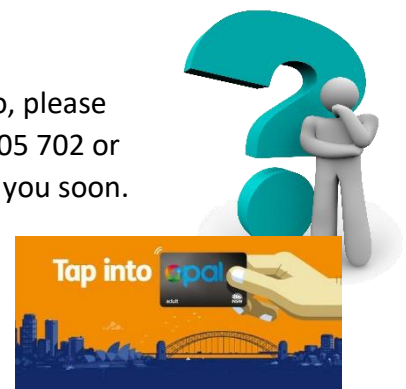
